About This Lesson

In this lesson, students explore the importance of interests and the link between interests and activities they can do now and when they're adults. They also have the chance to reflect on one of their interests.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this lesson, students will:

- Define interests and understand how the things they like can help define who they are
- Explore the link between interests and various activities
- Reflect on their own interests and favorite things
- Interview someone they know about their own interests to appreciate people's differences

Activity 1 - Mission: Interests

Direct students to complete **Mission: Interests**, where they will consider what it would mean if they lost all their interests.

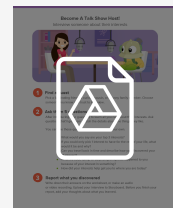

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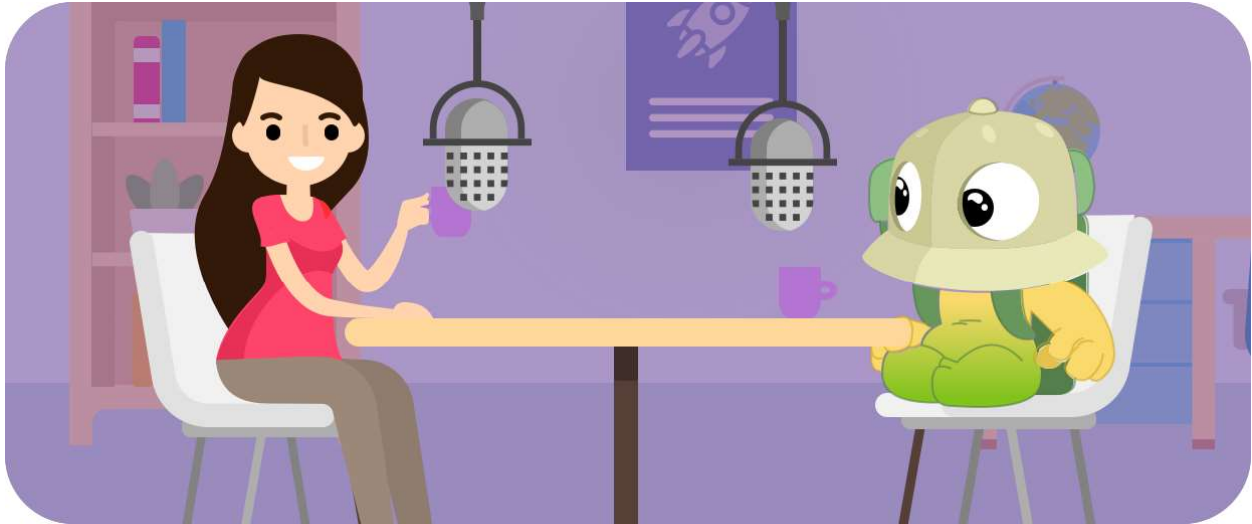
