

Part 1: Educator Needs Assessment

OVERVIEW

The first step in preparing to launch Xello is to identify who needs to know about Xello and what they need to know. Below you will find an example of a completed Educator Needs Assessment for high school counselors, along with instructions to complete your own on the following page.

Part 2: College and Career Readiness Timeline

OVERVIEW

The next step in preparing to launch Xello is to map out all of your district’s existing College and Career Readiness (CCR) initiatives and programs. This will allow you to integrate Xello into your district’s in a way that complements existing programs and fills in gaps. Below, you will find an example of a completed CCR timeline for grade 11. INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1: The following page contains a blank timeline template. For each grade level that will use Xello, create a copy of this timeline, and write the grade level at the top of the template.

Step 2: For each grade, list all the different CCR activities that are currently taking place in your district in the “ACTIVITY” column.

Step 3: In the “WHO LEADS THIS?” column, list the name(s) of whoever in the district leads that activity.

Step 4: Indicate when each activity takes place during the school year by copying and pasting the dots from the top row into the appropriate months for each activity.

Step 5: Add in the Xello lessons that your district has chosen for each grade level as additional items under the “ACTIVITY” column. Also add in who will lead them, and when they will take place.

Step 6: Add in any additional activities that should be completed in Xello such as “Complete the Matchmaker Assessment”, and include who will lead each activity and when it will take place.

Step 7: You can delete the timelines for any grade levels that won’t be using Xello.

Once you complete your district’s CCR timelines, you should have a clearer picture of how Xello fits into your district. Use these timelines to communicate with your district’s educators and administrators about how Xello fits into your overall college and career readiness program.

Part 3: Xello Rollout Plan

OVERVIEW

The final step in preparing to launch Xello is to identify strategies and tactics to engage educators in your district before, during, and after introducing Xello to students. WHO DOES WHAT?

It is important to note that there are three high-level types of people to think about in your Xello Rollout Plan:

- **Xello champions:** These are your district’s go-to people who know the most about Xello, and likely have administrative access to the program.
- **Educators:** These are the people who are using Xello directly with students.
- **Students:** These are the students who use Xello either at school or at home.

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1: For each of the 3 phases of launching Xello (Before, During, and After), we have provided a list of steps you can take, including thought-starters for how to approach each step. Review the steps (in the “What needs to happen” column) and the thought-starters (in the “Thought starters”) column.

Step 2: Identify how your district will achieve each step. Use the thought-starters as inspiration, and complete the “How will our district do this?” column.

Step 3: Specify approximately when your district will complete each step by filling out the “When will we do this?” column.

When you have completed the rollout plan, you should have a detailed timeline that you can use to unify your district and move forward in rolling out Xello to your students.

Day 1 of launching Xello

<p>STEP 1: Students need an introduction to Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators can introduce Xello by doing a demo of their student demo account. They can take on a student persona, or complete the demo using their own experiences and interests. • Educators can designate Xello student ambassadors, who get early access to Xello and can share their thoughts about Xello with fellow students on Day 1. 		
<p>STEP 2: Students need to understand why Xello is important and how it fits into the bigger picture</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators can communicate to students how Xello fits into the existing goals of that classroom or counseling setting. Establishing relevance will help with student adoption of Xello. • Educators can share stories about their own career journey as a way to demonstrate the relevance of Xello with students. 		
<p>STEP 3: Students need to log in to Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators take note of how their students will log into Xello and post the instructions somewhere that is easily accessible. 		
<p>STEP 4: Students need to understand what they are expected to accomplish with Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators should clearly define the first steps they want students to take in Xello and post them somewhere that is easily accessible.

<p>STEP 1: Educators need to ensure that students are on-track in Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Xello leads and educators can keep an eye on reports in Xello to identify where educators and students might need additional support. 		
<p>STEP 2: Educators need to support and troubleshoot any challenges they face using Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators can use the Xello help site and contact Xello’s client solutions team with questions or challenges. • Xello champions can hold office hours or drop-in sessions for educators who have questions about how to use Xello with students. 		
<p>STEP 3: Educators need to find more ways to get value out of Xello and enable students to learn even more about themselves in their own time</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators can incorporate Xello into robust lesson plans using the supplemental lesson resources for Xello 3-5 and Xello 6-12, as well as the supplementary activities for Xello K-2. • Educators can utilize the district’s CCR timeline to get visibility to all the other CCR activities and events happening in their district, and find ways to connect Xello to those existing initiatives. 		
<p>STEP 4: Students need to understand what they are expected to accomplish with Xello</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Educators should clearly define the first steps they want students to take in Xello, and post them somewhere easy for students to access.
