About Me / Glossary

Matchmaker Interest Quiz

The career-match assessment matches students' interests directly to careers, allowing students to see exactly why a career is a strong match or not. Transparency enables in-depth reflection on the relationship between careers and the students' own interests.

Personality Style Quiz

A Personality profile (based on the Holland code) helps students better understand who they are and how that relates to individual occupations.

Learning Style Quiz

The Learning Style inventory helps students understand different ways of learning how they best learn.

Favourite Clusters

Students can review the Career Clusters and save their favourites in the About Me. Students can also see their recommended career clusters and filter their career list by cluster when exploring their options.

Experiences Timeline

Students create a graphical timeline of their education, volunteer, life, and work experiences. Entries include names, organisations, and reflective questions.

Work Experiences

Students log their paid and unpaid work experiences in their Experiences timeline, reflecting on what they liked, what they found challenging, and what they learned in each case.

Volunteer Experiences

Students log their volunteer and community service participation in their Experiences timeline, including hours completed, reflecting on what they liked, what they found challenging, and what they learned in each case.

Education Experiences

Students log their educational achievements in their Experiences timeline, reflecting on what they liked, what they found challenging, and what they learned in each case.



About Me / Glossary

Life Experiences

From extracurricular activities to travel to significant life events, students can record meaningful events experiences, reflecting on what they liked, what they found challenging, and what they learned in each case.

Skills

Students identify and rate their skills. They can select from predefined lists in categories like Communication & Teamwork, Leadership, and Information & Analysis, or they can enter their own.

Interests

Students identify their personal interests. They can select from predefined lists in categories like Science & Technology, Arts & Culture, and Clubs & Organisations, or they can enter their own.

Places

Students map out where they currently live, where they were born, and where their family is originally from.

Storyboard

Storyboard is a place where students can collect artifacts and evidence for who they are and tell their own story through images videos, documents, links, and more. Once they add something, they can add reflective comments for why they included it and why it is important to them.



Explore Options / Glossary

Careers

Students can explore richly descriptive, easy-to-understand career profiles with key information on education, workplaces, wages, and job outlook. When students save a career they're interested in, they are prompted to complete additional investigation, rating, and reflection.

Colleges & Universities

Students can explore and save engaging, detailed college and university profiles that include key facts on enrollment, costs, and programs. An interactive campus map that lets them see what's nearby and take a virtual campus tour using Google Street View.

Courses & Apprenticeships

Students can explore and save course and apprenticeship profiles with admission requirements, tuition and fees, similar courses or apprenticeships, and related careers.

Saved Options / Glossary

Reflective Prompts

A variety of cards prompt students to reflect on important factors to consider for the careers they have saved in Xello.



Goals and Plans / Glossary

My Plans

Connecting the dots between their saved careers, school, and subjects, students create visual roadmaps.

Dashboard / Glossary

Links & Resources

Put links to websites, documents, and other resources right at students' fingertips. Educators can add resources that appear on the dashboard that students see when they log in to Xello.

Assignments

Projects can be submitted and tracked as assignments. Educators can see which students have submitted work and provide feedback to students.



School Subjects at Work

(Recommended Year 7)

Students relate school subjects to various tasks, reflect on their favourite school subject, and explore ways to use their favourite school subject in a career that interests them.

Interests

(Recommended Year 7)

Students reflect on some of the interests they have saved in Xello, explore the link between interests and various careers, and investigate how their interests match up with a career they like.

Time Management

(Recommended Year 7)

Students identify activities that they need to do, such as sleeping and eating, and those which are wants, such as playing video games. They also investigate how time management skills and tools can help them organise their time better.

Discover Learning Pathways

(Recommended Year 8)

Students investigate their post-secondary pathway options, explore the postsecondary pathways to various careers, and evaluate the pathways they could take to a career that interests them.

Explore Learning Styles

(Recommended Year 8)

After completing the Learning Style Quiz, students investigate visual, auditory, and tactile learning styles, and explore how understanding their own learning style can help them in school and on the job.

Biases and Career Choices

(Recommended Year 8)

Students address common preconceptions about certain careers, and explore non-traditional careers by challenging stereotypical thinking and raising aspirations.



Skills

(Recommended Year 9)

Students explore the skills required to perform various activities, as well as the link between their skills and career goals.

Explore Career Matches

(Recommended Year 9)

After completing the first part of the careermatch assessment, students investigate central, secondary, and other aspects of the career match assessment, and how they relate to careers, reflect on their results, and explore the aspects for a career that interests them.

Self Advocacy

(Recommended Year 9)

Students understand the importance of a positive self-concept and self-advocacy and identify a range of situations where they may need support and, explore where and how they can get the help they need.

Getting Experience

(Recommended Year 10)

Students explore different ways they can get work experience now. They identify several ways to get experience while still in school: community service/volunteerism, co-op programs, part-time jobs, internships, etc. and assess which type of experience is best suited for their career interests and goals.

Personality Styles

(Recommended Year 10)

After completing the second part of the career match assessment, students investigate personality styles, and explore how their own personality style can help them at home, school, work, and other areas of their life.

Study Skills and Habits

(Recommended Year 10)

Students assess their own study skills and habits and work through scenarios that help them understand how to overcome obstacles to good study habits. They identify strategies they can employ to improve their study skills and explore their own motivations for working hard.



Work Values

(Recommended Year 11)

Students explore their own work values and investigate careers that they may find satisfying based on their values.

Workplace Skills and Attitudes

(Recommended Year 11)

Students explore skills and behaviours that employers look for, such as time management (plan/organise work), dependability, good attitude, communication skills, problem-solving, etc. Students explain why these skills and behaviours are important to various careers, and how they manifest on the job, assess their own employability skills.

Transition to FE

(Recommended Year 11)

Students explore through activities what it will be like to learn in the college / sixth form environment and how this will differ from secondary school. They also work through activities designed to help them prepare for a successful transition to FE.

Choosing a University

(Recommended Year 12)

Students identify which factors are important to them in a potential postsecondary school, and investigate how a university matches up to their priorities.

Career Demand

(Recommended Year 12)

Students learn about job projections and outlook, analyse factors that impact job demand, such as changes in technology, demographics, business practices or production methods, consumer preferences, and workplace restructuring, and explore how their career plans may be shaped by demand for a career that interests them.

Work/Life Balance

(Recommended Year 12)

Students understand the importance of maintaining a healthy life-work balance and learn about the working conditions of careers they are interested in.



Career Backup Plans

(Recommended Year 13)

Students understand the importance of career backup plans, and explore potential backup careers for themselves.

Defining Success

(Recommended Year 13)

Students explore what success means to them in various aspects of life, including their personal life, school, and career and develop strategies to achieve it.

Job Interviews

(Recommended Year 13)

Students explore ways to prepare for a job interview, describe their own abilities and qualifications in the context of an interview, investigate job interview questions in the context of a career that interests them, and explore appropriate post-interview behaviours and actions.

Career Path Choices

(Recommended Year 13)

Students consider both career market demand changes and personal developments that may affect their career choices. The lesson is personalised by drawing on careers the students have saved within Xello, as well as their saved interests.
